Vermont Students and Parents, Know Your Rights! <u>Education Rights for Families with Housing Problems</u>

Do you...

- Move a lot?
- Live in a motel or shelter?
- Live with friends or relatives?
- Live in a vehicle, campground, park, or abandoned building?
- Consider yourself to be homeless?

Because of...

- Eviction?
- Job loss?
- Foreclosure?
- Money problems?
- Natural or man-made disaster?
- Domestic violence?
- Aging-out of foster care?
- Another similar reason?

If you answered yes to any of these questions, you or your school-age children **should know the following!**

• YOUR CHILDREN HAVE A LEGAL RIGHT TO:

- 1. Attend and enroll in school *immediately* (even without all the paperwork)
- 2. Enroll or remain in school without a permanent address
- 3. Stay in the school of origin (when it is in their best interest)
- 4. Go to school in the local school district
- 5. Have transportation to and from school paid for by the school district
- 6. Participate in <u>all</u> school-related programs, activities, and sports
- 7. Receive special education services and accommodations (if eligible)
- 8. <u>Automatically</u> qualify for free and reduced meals at school

What if the school refuses to let your child attend that school?

- All public schools <u>must</u> enroll children and youth who qualify as "homeless" according to the questions on page 1.
- If the school refuses to let your child attend and you disagree, the school <u>must</u>:
 - 1. Enroll your child until the dispute is resolved
 - 2. Quickly arrange a meeting with you and the school's "homeless liaison"
 - 3. Tell you **in writing** why it does not believe your child can be enrolled
 - 4. Tell you about your right to appeal the school's decision and how
 - 5. Continue to enroll you or your child during your appeal or until a suitable school is found

Are you under 18, and without a legal guardian or awaiting foster care placement?

- You still have a **RIGHT** to go to **YOUR** school!
- You have the <u>same rights</u> as described on page 1, use them!

Who should I contact with questions?
